Using CEEQUAL on very large and/or long-duration Projects

For most projects that apply for a CEEQUAL Award, the usual Whole Team Award assessing the role of the client, designer and principal contractor is sufficient to give an overall score. Multi-package assessments with separate scores and Awards for each package are used when it would, for a range of reasons, be impractical to assess a large and complicated project as one assessment.

The multi-package assessment process enables separate CEEQUAL assessments of individual packages of works to be completed. The individual package scores are then aggregated (on the basis of the individual package contract values) to give an overall Whole Team Award for the project.



17 multi-package assessments were used at the Olympic Park and scored between 75.2% and 94.7%. The overall weighted score was 93.8% ('Excellent').
